



Terms and Conditions for All Qualified Recipients Developing a Derivate Work of the *Assessing the Maine Coast* website

We're pleased to be able to share *Assessing the Maine Coast* with you to use as a template for your own site. The source code and content are provided free of charge, but we ask that you agree to the following terms and conditions as consideration for using these materials.

1. Maine Sea Grant owns the copyright to the source code and content of the "Assessing the Maine Coast" website ("Site"). You are entitled to make a derivative work of the Site and to own copyright to the derivative work but not the underlying Site itself. Your derivative work must include changes to the content to reflect the laws of your state and to delete references to Maine and to Maine laws to the extent they differ. Your derivative work must also include different photographic images throughout the Site. To avoid copyright licensing issues, Maine Sea Grant does not authorize you to re-use the photographs in the Site.
2. Neither Maine Sea Grant nor its collaborators are responsible for the content of your derivative work, including the accuracy of any of the legal information contained in the Site or in your new site.
3. Maine Sea Grant requests that you submit an update on the status of your project 6 months after having received the Site files from Maine Sea Grant. This will enable us to track the progress of our efforts to share the web model with stakeholders throughout the country.
4. Notwithstanding the foregoing, you agree to give Maine Sea Grant and its collaborators attribution for providing the Site, by including in the "About" section (or equivalent) the following paragraph:
